### From the Pastor's Desk . . .



The really cold days of mid November made me think that there could be snow this Christmas! It is cold

enough, early enough so maybe, just maybe, we can have a white Christmas this year! I enjoy snow if it is not too cold or too windy and the snow doesn't cause power outages! But there is something mystical about waking up to a blanket of snow on Christmas day!

During my time as a United Methodist minister, since 1983, I have experienced snow on Christmas eve and Christmas day two times. And I recall the wonder and awe I and many others from the church had when we stepped outside after the midnight Christmas Eve service to the lightly falling snow as we sang Joy to the World! It was absolutely breath taking! And you know, it made all the folks at the service have a deeper, warmer feeling about them. Oh. the snow didn't change the Christmas message that God loved us so much that he sent His Son as an infant to become Savior of the World. We still rejoiced in this gift as we sang Away In A Manger, Come Thou Long Expected Jesus and O Come All Ye Faithful. We still greeted each other with hugs and smiles. We laughed at the children's play and felt so proud of them for sharing the Christmas story in their own unique way. And the communion, reminding us of the fulfillment of Jesus' promise to save the world, was so special

as we looked into the manger knowing the sacrifice he would make for us. Yes, all the fears and rush of Christmas melted away at least for a few minutes.

But when we went outside, the gently falling snow flakes vaulted me and many others to our child-hood when we prayed and prayed for a white Christmas and rarely ever saw one! It made many simply giddy as they saw the confluence of snow and Christmas happening there before their eyes.

I know that it made it impossible to get to the relatives house for a few days. That was frustrating. But when my family and I accepted that then. Christmas day had a whole new dimension to it. We didn't have to rush through opening presents, getting breakfast so we could get on the road. Everyone gave us "a pass" for not getting to the extended family get-together. Christmas day became a peaceful time of resting, playing in the snow, hot chocolate, watching "It's a Wonder Life" that played continuously. And it also gave pause to reflect on the true meaning of Christmas, of God's love for us and sending a savior to meet us just where we are! (I am glad on these two occasions we didn't lose power and we had plenty to eat, two other blessing of those Christmas') The snow on those two Christmas eves and Christmas days were two of the best I experienced even though it messed up plans we had. But, that was ok, because it was God's way of slowing me down and enabling me to soak in the Christmas that I had been preaching about and going about as hard as I could go for

the 8 weeks leading up the Christmas Eve. And that was such a wonderful Christmas gift to me.

So, in the coming weeks, don't be surprised if you hear me say that I am hoping for a white Christmas. If it happens, I know that God has some great blessing for us when we are forced to stop and "just be" because the snow has given us that opportunity. I look forward to our Advent worship, decorating the serving in missions church. through the Christmas store, helping families through the Pastor's Discretionary Fund who request help to have presents for their kids, singing the cantata that Lisa and the choir have worked so hard on, the following brunch provided by the UM Men, the various Christmas parties by various groups in the church, and finally seeing you at one of our Christmas eve services. May each of you have a wonderful Christmas, share the wonder of this season with those who are lost and those who are missing loved ones, and make it a priority to be at our services and attend the Christmas Eve service to see if we will be delighted again this year by the unique design of each snow flake as it gently falls on us while we sing Joy to the World out on the front lawn of the church!

### **Reflection on Advent and Christmas**

We've been hearing about Christmas since before Halloween! The Black Friday sales started when we turned the calendar over to November. The culture is revved up and promoting Christmas as a season to give more and bigger gifts. It justifies its actions based on Santa Claus and all the traditions related to him. . But somewhere along the way the culture and the celebration of Christmas has gotten disconnected. Buying, Buying, Buying is not what God had in mind! Advent is a time we prepare for the recognition that God came as a baby. that God continues to be with us in the holy Spirit and that God will return at some future time to redeem this world we allive in.

Thirdly, give more to ministries that help the needy; the ones Jesus tells us to help!

And lastly, Love All. Let Jesus be the model. Who did He show love Jesus had a way of looking through the outside and seeing one's heart. How might we look beyond ones skin color, one's accent, one's clothing, one's tattoos, one's mannerisms and see the person

God created. All of us need love and Jesus uses us to show that love.


